South Africa, ZS. The special event stations ZS100SARL, ZS6SRL and ZS9HQ celebrate the 100th anniversary of the South African Radio League (SARL) until the end of 2025.

South Africa, ZS. ZS4AFV, from the SA Armour Museum, will be active on Friday 21 and Saturday 22 November from the Maluti Military Fair at the Sandstone Heritage Estate in the Eastern Free State. The suffix stands for Armoured Fighting Vehicle. QSL via ClubLog.

Malawi, 7Q. Chris, ZS6RI has been active as 7Q5C from near Karonga in northern Malawi since 28 October. For the next year or two, he will be working there on a six-week on/off rotation, with planned activity on 40 to 10 metres "99% CW" during his spare time. QSOs will be uploaded to LoTW, QRZ Logbook and Club Log; paper QSLs will not be issued.

Mozambique, C9. Paulo, ZS6CRZ, is now active as C95CRZ from Tete, Mozambique and is currently working there. He posts, "I have recently put up my very basic station, it is all still very much a 'work in progress.' I am operating a very basic rig consisting of a 100 W TK-80 Kenwood, with a MFJ tuner and a home brewed EFHW antenna (20 m wire length). I also set up a home brewed 40 m dipole. I am planning on getting a beam up shortly." He was spotted recently (24 October) on 20 m SSB. Look for him to update his C95CRZ QRZ page.

Morocco, CN. Members of the Association Royale des Radio Amateurs du Maroc will be active on various bands and modes as CN50MS between 1 and 8 November. In addition, CN amateurs can use the prefix 5C50 (e.g. 5C50AM for CN8AM) during the same time frame. QSL via operator's instructions. The special call sign and prefix commemorate the 50th anniversary of the so-called Marche Verte

(Green March), a mass demonstration in support of the restoration of the Moroccan Sahara and the conclusion of the Spanish colonial rule.

Algeria, 7X. Mohamed, 7X2VFK, reports: To mark the 71st anniversary of the Algerian Revolution, the team will soon be active with the special callsign, 7R1N, on all bands during the month of November 2025.

Senegal, 6W. Billy, F4GJE, is once again active as 6W1RD from near Dakar (WW Loc. IK14GQ), Senegal, as of 23 October. The length of his stay is unknown. Activity will be on 80 to 6 m bands using SSB and digital. QSL via EA7FTR.

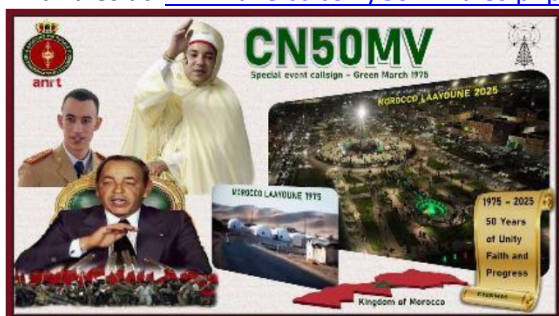

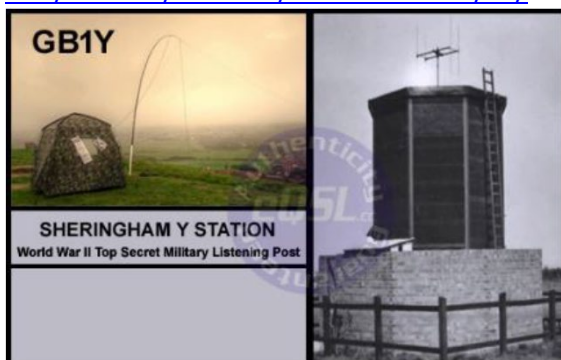

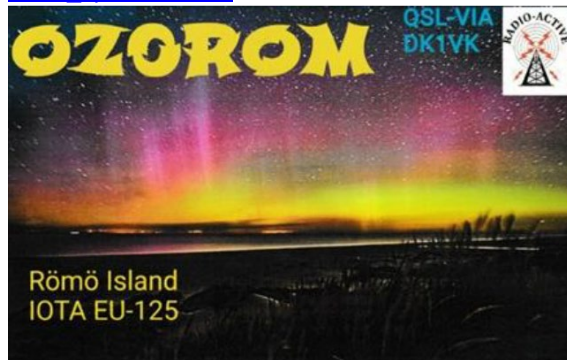
