6.	APPROVAL OF THE 2019 AGM MINUTES	
6.1	No AGM was held in 2020 due to the COVID-19 health regulations in place at the time. The Minutes of the 2019 AGM have not yet been accepted and are presented to this AGM. The minutes were approved by electronic vote with 262 votes in favour, 2 votes against and 24 abstentions.	
7.	PRESIDENTS REPORT	
7.1	Nico, ZS6QL, presented the Presidents Report and the SARL Annual Report.	
7.2	<p>It is always good practice to reflect on the previous years (2019/20) and use the successes and accomplishments as input to identify specific goals for the following years including ongoing activities.</p> <p>Last year started with a highlight as we once again participated at Hobby-X show in Johannesburg with a larger and improved stand compared to the previous year to introduce and promote amateur radio to the public during March 2020. This was a week prior to the announcement of the national lockdown.</p> <p>The SARL commemorated 95 years since its founding in 1925 and we had very little opportunity to celebrate other than activating a special call sign ZS95SARL used by quite a few of our members. 	<p>planning of the celebration event to take place during the 2019 AGM and Awards Dinner had to be cancelled.</p>	
7.3	<p>The COVID-19 crisis has led to a dramatic change in the way we live, work, shop, travel and travel in our daily lives. The economic and social disruption caused by this pandemic is devastating with only speculation of when it will end.</p> <p>Not in our wildest dreams could we ever imagine the impact of this pandemic, the lockdown and numerous restrictions imposed on society.</p> <p>It is only recently that we started to examine what it means for family, our friends including the Amateur Radio fraternity worldwide to understand that only together can we overcome this disruption caused by the pandemic back to what we perceived as normal again, taking into consideration on how our lives will change.</p>	
7.4	<p>When we examine the impact on Amateur Radio and the SARL, it is evident that the pandemic inspired many of our Clubs and members to step up to the challenge to keep the engine of the Amateur Radio Service running and its wheels turning.</p> <p>From the various efforts observed to keep RAE classes continuing throughout the country by means of online classes to the accomplishment of hosting two national examination sessions are remarkable. This was only possible with the dedication and commitment of the RAE manager Noel, ZR6DX, Kelley Heslop, our Office Administrator, all our Chief Invigilators including the lecturers countrywide.</p>	
7.5	<p>In addition to advancing Amateur Radio through the RAE in South Africa, the SARL have Memorandums of Understanding (MoU) with Namibia, Botswana and Kenia and in the pipeline Malawi to support RAE classes, study material and administering the examinations on behalf of their Communication Authorities under the leadership of the SARL RAE Manager.</p>	
7.6	<p>The Covid-19 pandemic also had a major influence on IARU Region 1. The scheduled October 2020 General Conference in Novi Sad, Serbia could not take place, but the Executive Committee of Region 1 arranged and presented a virtual General Conference on the GoToMeeting platform from 11 to 16 October 2020. Three sessions per day were held covering C2 – Finances, C3 – Administration, C4 – HF Matters, C5 – VHF/UHF and Microwaves and C7 – EMC. The Youth WG, the Spectrum and Regulatory Liaison Committee and the Political Relations Committee also met during the week. It was possible for the League to have ten delegates participate in the Conference streams.</p> <p>The SARL had submitted two Papers for the Conference - NS20_C3_20 SARL - IARU Region 1 Technology Working Group and NS20_C7_03 SARL - Noise Monitoring Project. Both Papers were accepted, a steering committee was formed to work on the Terms</p>

	<p>of Reference for the Technology Working Group. Hans van de Groenendaal, ZS6AKV and Anton Janovsky ZR6AIC serves on the committee.</p> <p>Paper NS20_C4_09 Morse code - an intangible cultural heritage was accepted, a working group has been created to assist Member Societies in having Morse Code registered as an intangible cultural heritage, following the examples of Germany, Belgium and the Netherlands. Dennis Green, ZS4BS represents the SARL in the WG.</p> <p>Region 1 continues planning for a face-to-face Conference in October 2021 in Novi Sad with the theme of “The Future of Amateur Radio.” The first online Workshop leading up to the October Conference, took place on Wednesday 24 March 2021. The next online Workshop will take place on Wednesday 21 April 2021 with more planned leading up to October.</p>	
7.7	<p>The motto of “Amateur Radio: Home but not Alone” came about as a result of a renewed interest in the hobby, locally and internationally. On air activity increased and resulted in our spectrum being occupied and utilised. Please keep up these activities to ensure that our most valuable asset we as radio amateur possess are used to its full potential.</p>	
7.8	<p>A recent development to encourage more activity on the V/UHF frequencies, the V/UHF Beacon Working Group under the leadership of Brian Jacobs, ZS6YZ embarked on a Next Generation Beacon project. The team consist of an enthusiastic group of men with a vision to establish new generation beacons countrywide and promote all aspects of V/UHF communication. If HF is not challenging or active enough in your opinion, then we encourage our members to get involved in long distance V/UHF activities.</p>	
7.9	<p>Sadly, our younger generation groups and activities (Hammies and youth Clubs) came to a standstill. As our youngsters could not meet in person, the interest dwindled. I would like to challenge our Clubs to start with activities to regain the interest of our youth once more. The inclusion and education of our youth is the foundation of preparation to ensure that our fascinating hobby will continue to exist into the future.</p> <p>The SARL in collaboration with AMSAT SA continued the important work to foster and encourage self-learning and innovation of new commercial and amateur technology. This was once again accomplished through online workshops held on topics such as SDR (Software Defined Radio), V/UHF propagation, antenna design, RF noise floor monitoring and general aspects of RF interference. We will continue to present these online workshops as a wider audience can be reached, so please keep an eye on the news bulletins for future dates.</p>

	<p>The SARL Unlocking Amateur Radio Technology Online Symposium on 17 March 2021 was well attended and positive feedback received. A word of sincere thanks to everyone who participated.</p>	
7.10	<p>Financially I am pleased to report that the SARL is in a good financial position with sufficient reserves to support and ensure the continuous sustainability of the League going forward. Please participate in casting your votes on the SARL website in order to finalise the approval process of the Annual Financial Statement.</p> <p>Our membership is steady, as seen the previous year, an average of 43.5% of all licences issued by ICASA are SARL members, and there is a definite capacity for growth. This is well above the typical 34% in the IARU-Region 1 as reported earlier in the year. From an RAE perspective, we only retain around 44% of all newcomers to the hobby as SARL members from statistics captured since 2009.</p> <p>The SARL is certainly not a trivial operation to manage. I am satisfied and most thankful for the excellent work being done by fellow councillors, portfolio managers and appointees who are all volunteers with families and full-time occupations, committing their personal time including expertise at no cost in running the SARL successfully.</p>	
7.11	<p>From a holistic perspective, our news team ensures a national news bulletin for transmission on Sundays in conjunction with the dedicated work of the Editor of Radio ZS. Then there is in the background a group of individuals looking after the Forum and Swop Shop, the Website and Database Management work. Then we look at the portfolios pertaining to Awards Management, Repeater coordination working group, V/UHF working group, QSL Bureau Management, Contest Management, Youth development, the Amateur Radio Today programme and Regulatory Affairs. We also acknowledge the indispensable work of the SARL/ICASA liaison committee meeting with the Regulator including the excellent work of the SARL HAMNET organisation serving our communities and providing a public service.</p> <p>Please read more about the various activities and work done in the SARL 2020 – 2021 Annual Report compiled by our Secretary Dennis, ZS4BS.</p>	
7.12	<p>John C. Mather once said that there is strength in numbers, but organising those numbers is one of the great challenges. We are a sizeable organisation but recruiting individuals to serve on council and in the various portfolios is most challenging. In addition to this, one of the many challenges that we face is that our pool of professionals is exceptionally small in relation to the work to be done which are becoming more demanding, especially in the regulatory environment with less organisations in industry and</p>

	government being sympathetic to the amateur radio fraternity. We cannot afford this and need to identify individuals and develop sustainable and capable working groups to carry forward the work required to take the amateur radio service forward in South Africa. Please do not hesitate to contact the Secretary should you be able to assist with experience in the regulatory environment or a technical field.	
7.13	In conclusion and as touched on in this report, we have many challenges, personal and League as well as Club related to face in this pandemic environment. I am confident that we will learn from our experiences and together will overcome the disruptions caused by this pandemic.	
7.14	Let us keep moving forward to open new doors together to ensure that the Amateur Radio Service continues to grow and prosper into the future. Remember, none of our achievements and successes are possible without the continuous support, commitment, individual sacrifices and dedication of our members, talented volunteers and councillors.	
7.15	I would like to thank all members for your support and dedication to the SARL's mission in advancing the art, science and enjoyment of Amateur Radio in South Africa and globally.	
8.	FINANCES	
8.1	This report was prepared and presented by Chris Turner, ZS6GM Vice President on behalf of Cliff Smyth, ZS6BOX, the Honorary Treasurer.	
8.2	<p>I want to start this report by acknowledging Cliff Smyth, treasurer and Dr Dennis Kotze of His Way Booking Services for the excellent way in which they have assisted Council in keeping a tight rein on the League Finances and in managing the member contributions with a high degree of professionalism. The SARL has operated within its approved budget whilst providing members with the services promised at the Stellenbosch AGM in 2019.</p> <p>The past year has presented serious challenges due to the Covid-19 restrictions not least the inability of the League to hold any gatherings and group activities. However, this has also resulted in the ability to save on travel and other group activity expenses which has resulted in lower than budgeted expenses. See the annual accounts for year ending June 2020 and interim accounts for the period ending 28 February 2021.</p> <p>I would like to clarify the reason for the incorporation of the Hamnet accounts into the SARL AFS in order to clear up any confusion. Hamnet is a department of the SARL and even though Hamnet operates as an autonomous organisation it is responsible to properly report and account for funds and donations received and expenses incurred in its operation. The Council of the SARL is responsible for ensuring that the Hamnet funds are effectively</p>

	<p>managed and audited. But Council does not interfere with the financial affairs of the Hamnet Regions provided that the regions do not create any liability for the members of the League. For practical and operational purposes, when reading the accounts, members should ignore the assets and the surplus of receipts over expenses attributed to Hamnet because they do not affect the day to day operation and affairs of the League.</p>	
8.3	<p>Council has used the period to turn the negative effects of the Covid-19 lockdown and restrictions into a positive outcome for League finances. By curbing expenditure and by careful allocation of funds, the Cash and Cash Equivalents has risen by R356,998 to R2,196,365 resulting in the Net Value of the South African Radio League increasing by R82,232 to R517,556. Council has therefore been able to build up the League's Reserve Accounts.</p> <p>Council set aside a reserve of R30,000 for the Amateur Radio Development Fund and R23,548 for Youth Activity.</p> <p>Because Sentech has not given any indication on whether the 30 year lease agreement for the National Amateur Radio Centre will be extended in 7 years' time, Council considers it prudent to put aside money each year, in order to provide funds in the case that the NARC is forced to relocate. For this reason, Council has created an NARC Contingency Reserve with an initial amount of R100,000.</p>	
8.4	<p>SARL's Income increased by R41,769 mainly due to a rise in Subscriptions of R31,655 resulting from an increase in membership for the reporting period.</p> <p>Council has proposed a modest 4% rise in subscriptions for the next financial year. Bear in mind that Council froze subscriptions in the previous financial year due to the economic situation and hardship experienced by members. Prudent financial management and long term stability of the League dictates that subscriptions should at least keep pace with inflation.</p>

8.5.1	<p>The approval of the Annual Financial Statement for the year ending 30 June 2020 was obtained by an electronic vote. Votes in favour: 202, votes against: 0 and Abstentions: 7. Total eligible to vote: 1 690 members; Total members voted: 209; Percentage vote: 12,36%.</p>	
8.6	Receive Interim Financial Statement for the 8 months ending 28 February 2012	
8.6.1	<p>The Interim Financial Statement was approved by electronic voting. Votes in favour: 260, votes against: 12 and Abstentions: 16.</p>

11.1.2	All amateurs with the legacy license (old paper licence) are required to register on the new ICASA online system, by the end of May 2021. The SARL ICASA working committee is working with ICASA to get this date extended. However, do not wait for the last minute to register. You are required to register even if your current legacy licence is due to expire in a few years' time.

11.1.3	<p>Follow this simple step by step procedure to register.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Register as a user at https://online.icasa.org.za/ 2. On the right-hand side of the page click on register. 3. Create a new account, i.e., e-mail address and insert a password, then confirm that password. 4. As soon as you submit the registration you will receive an e-mail with a link that you must click to verify the registration. 5. Please look in your Junk folder if you do not receive the e-mail. 6. After completion you can log into the system. 7. The first time that you start to use the system it will prompt you to create a legal entity by capturing all your personal details. 8. Uploading a copy of your ID book in the link provided at the bottom of the registration page. Note: only PDF documents are accepted. 9. After submission it will be subjected to approval by the Authority. 10. After approval by the Authority, you will receive an e-mail indicating that applications can be submitted. 11. Click on the Manage button on the main page under Radio Frequency Spectrum. 12. Click on the Amend Legacy Radio Frequency License Button. 13. Capture your license number, excluding all the dashes, then upload the HAREC and HF certificate. If you do not have these certificates, then upload a copy of your current or old license in place of the HAREC and HF certificate. If an old, expired license then upload the proof of payment as well. 14. The Authority will then complete the next step and return it to you for verification. 15. Verify for correctness and submit. 16. The Authority will then finalize the process and issue an electronic license that can also be downloaded on your Manage page. <p>Note: Once you have submitted your ID Book with all your details, send an e-mail with, "Amateur Radio and the application number," in the subject line to DKuhrau@icasa.org.za or PJansen@icasa.org.za</p>	
11.1.4	<p>For club call signs best to register the club as a legal entity. Club will have to give authority to a third party, signed by the chairman in his capacity.</p> <p>Clubs have to provide their constitution.</p> <p>Repeaters have to be applied for on behalf of a club.</p> <p>Special event call signs require a motivation letter and can only be done for a one-year period.</p> <p>SARL will help clubs with repeater/special event applications where required.</p> <p>Documentation available from the SARL.</p> <p>RAE candidates' licences will be applied for via the SARL.</p>
